M\$C Financial Committee Report Submitted by Mike Georgopolis

The financial status of the RivUnitI Association is good. After careful

review of the 2003 actual figures, and a hard look at the 2004 budget, the financial committee feels that the Association is on the right track. We are running a bit ahead on YTD budget-to-actual with money in the bank for the operating account and have around \$18,000 in reserves.

It was decided to audit the records of Argus Mgmt. during the special board meeting recently. On Thursday, March 11, Floyd, Margery and Mike met with Argus at their accounting office conference room to work with Bob, Larry and the staff there. Many of the numbers-in-question have now been explained, clarified and properly charged and re-coded for 2003. In fact the closing Balance Sheet for 2003 is now accurate and is being restated by Argus and submitted to the board. Only a couple questions remain unanswered at this time for 2003 business.

For 2004, the end-of-February figures will reflect actual expenditures-to-date and present no surprises. By the end of March the numbers will look better than normal on an actual basis. It is clear to the committee that all budget items are in line with spending plans or can be fully explained if not.

A few things of importance:

- a) the audit process uncovered the issue of FPL charging the Association with a monthly sales tax on power usage. The committee will endeavor to see that this is curtailed at once and attempt to gain a reimbursement for the last 24 months of charges.
- b) we recommend that the Association report to the

members full financial detail on a quarterly basis only. This will save time and paper. A year-to-date single paragraph summary of budget highlights will appear monthly in the circular however.

- we recommend that the Association invest a substantial amount of the reserve in an interest paying certificate-ofdeposit. This is normal for associations like ours.
- Margery Arendt will be signing all checks to be disbursed by the Association now.
- e) we understand that the 'special projects' items detailed in line 7295 are initiated and will be started soon to upgrade our common space as planned in the budget.

MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Presented at the March 16th Board Meeting Submitted by Jack Martin

- 1. <u>SPRINKLERS</u>: Timers are in process of being reset to original times. 60% have been checked and the balance of meters will he reset within next ten days.
- 2. <u>WEEDS AND BARE SPOTS</u>: Valley Crest is inspecting yards samples are being sent to University of Florida for testing so that correct treatment can he applied.
- 3. <u>FOUR PROJECTS</u> are being considered for the clubhouse with completion in the next six weeks:
 - (a) Extend bottom step in front of club house (it is currently too narrow).
 - (b) Install hand rails
 - (c) Remove one section of fence so that a concrete walkway can he poured to connect the front (MSC) sidewalk to side ramp.
 - (d) The lack of gutters is causing damage, particularly to the front and rear steps. We are obtaining bids to install approx. 220 feet of guttering on three sides. The first bid amounted to \$948. Additional bids are forthcoming.
- 4. Ten volunteers gave the clubhouse a thorough cleaning inside and trimmed and cleaned the pool area.
- 5. A Maintenance Committee meeting will he held in early April to discuss:
 - (1) Sealing and painting the front and rear porches


- (2) Leveling the brick walk from the alley into the pool area.
- (3) Trimming or removing the four scheffleras at each end of the pool area. (4 Review paint colors for both porches
- 6. Thanks to Bob Axsiom for volunteering to inspect street lights on a monthly basis.
- Again our thanks to John Bee of Valley Crest for attending our meeting.
- The irrigation pump is causing concern. It is still
 cycling on-off in 1 0-1 5 second cycles. This is causing
 excessive wear on the pump which will eventually burn
 itself out. The Woodlands Board should he notified of
 the situation.




Dear Neighbors,

BLACK BEAN SALAD

Serves 4 to 6


1 can (16 oz.) black beans
1.1/2 cups fresh or frozen corn kernels
1/2 cup salsa
juice of 1 lime
1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro or parsley

- 1. Drain the black beans. Rinse and drain again. Place in a serving bowl.
- 2. Add the corn kernels. If using frozen corn, place in a strainer and run briefly under warm water to thaw, then drain well.
- 3. Fold in the salsa, lime juice and cilantro. Serve immediately or cover and refrigerate until serving time.


