Block Captains Submitted by Bill Straw

When we moved to Rivendell we became part of a very large development and in the Cottages are part of one section of the whole pie. There is a need to have a good information flow both to and from the governing board and management company for Rivendell and one aspect of that at the most local level is the Block Captain activity. It is a neighbor-helping-neighbor activity with people assigned the responsibility of spreading the word on news, events and activities as well as welcoming new residents and passing information back upstream to the board.

We have divided the cottages into four "sections" of about 21 homes each that are the responsibility of four block captains. They generally correspond to the "rows" of homes from front to back. Our block captains are Jackie Axsiom (490 — 516)

even numbers, 525— 541 odd numbers), Rosemary Haley (545 —577 odd numbers), John Costa / Vivian Kunkle (518— 564 even numbers) and Bill Straw (566 — 590). Bill gets information from the RCA board and notifies Rosemary, Jackie and John Nivian and they in turn pass it out to the homes on their 'route' and then confirm that 'their homes have been notified.

The result is a good and fast form of communication and feed back and confirmation that information has been delivered or not. Sometimes it is just as important to know who did not get notified, such as in cases of emergency notices, as it is just to get it out.

The Block Captain function is similar to our Cottages emergency notification system, but is used for more general information and communication from the Master Association Board to all of the members/homeowners.

If you are interested in volunteering to help with the Block Captain activity, please contact Bill Straw and he will put your name on the list for support and help as we refine the process.










ANNUAL GARAGE SALE

Mix all ingredients together in a 9x13 pan. Bake 35-45 minutes. Serve warm or cool. Top with whipping cream or ice cream as desired.








