PUMPKIN BREAD


Compliments of Llwana Propst

1 ¾ cups flour
1 ½ cups sugar
1 ½ cup butter or
1 tsp soda
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp salt
1 egg, beaten
1/2 Tsp Nutmeg
1/8 tsp ground cloves
1/2 cup butter or
margarine, melted
1 cup pumpkin
1 egg, beaten
1/3 cup water

Oven Temperature 350°

Sift dry ingredients together; make a well in center. Add butter, pumpkin, egg and water. Mix until dry ingredients are moistened. Pour into greased and floured 9x5 inch loaf pan. Bake at 350 degree for 1hr and 10 min or until done.






