"Spring" is in the air". Flowering bushes and plants are showing their colors and our Crepe Myrtle trees have been trimmed back by the landscape company which will enhance their blooms later in the season. Hibiscus, Indian Hawthorn and Star Jasmine bushes are in bloom. We hope you enjoyed the spectacular display of peach colored Amaryllis along the fence at 557 MSC and just inside the fence at 536 MSC it is a pleasure to see the Louis Phillipi roses as you walk by.

For those wanting to plant flowers for color, good choices are: Geraniums (need to be "dead headed" periodically), Lantana, Impatiens (plant in partial shade as they will wilt in the hot sun), Pentas & Blue Daze (prettiest in the morning before the heat of the day). A display of Blue Daze can be seen at 508 MSC along the front walk.

A word of caution if you plant annuals - County water restrictions apply! Our automated irrigation system can operate only once per week which means you'll need to "hand water" annuals when needed.

As you go through the Cottages - "take time to see the blossoms" and enjoy.

Sausage Rice Casserole

1/2 pound bulk Italian sausage

1/2 cup uncooked instant rice

1/4 cup chopped onion

1/4 teaspoon dried basil

1/4 chopped sweet red pepper

1/4 cup water

1 can (10-3/4 oz) condensed tomato soup, undiluted

1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons shredded part-skim mozzarella

cheese, divided

In a small skillet, cook sausage, onion & red peppers over medium heat until sausage is no longer pin: drain. Remove from the heat. Stir in the rice, basil, soup, water & 1/4 cup cheese.

Transfer to an ungreased 3-cup baking dish. Cover & bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes (or until rice is tender). Uncover, sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake for 5 minutes longer or until cheese has melted. This will make two servings.

WHAT'S WITH IRRIGATION

All timer boxes have been set per County regulations to operate for forty-five (45) minutes once per week. A maximum of six (6) timers should be "on" at the same time.

Residents are requested, <u>PLEASE DO NOT RESET</u> your timer. If you have a problem, contact the maintenance group at

There are some timers which are affected by an in-house power failure. If you lose power please notify the maintenance group

via e-mail immediately so as not to lose coverage.

During the recent inspection of the irrigation timer boxes it was noted there are several of the older timers which **should be** replaced. Most of the homes in the Cottages were originally equipped with **TORO GREENSKEEPER** timers. Many residents have already replaced their timers but there are some owners who should "think about" replacing theirs.

Your Maintenance Committee is presently contacting several irrigation companies to get prices for replacements. When we have what we feel is the best price & best value, those owners whose timer boxes should be replaced will be notified. Ultimately it's the owners responsibility to have the timer box in good operational order.
